




Welcome new class of 2025,

CHILDREN & FAMILIES SUMMER SAFETY

Here are some summer safety tips for families:

- **Hydration** Bring water with you instead of drinking from lakes or streams, which can be contaminated.
- Water Safety Make sure everyone in your family knows how to swim and stay above water. Always supervise children, even if they are strong swimmers, and don't mix alcohol and swimming.
- Sun Safety Wear broad-spectrum sunscreen with at least 30 SPF that protects against UVA and UVB rays. Look for a water-resistant formula, and also protect your eyes with sunglasses. For outdoor activities, dress children in loose, breathable, sweatproof, and waterproof clothing.
- **Bug Bites** Apply insect repellent before children go outside to protect them from mosquitos and other pests.
- **Heat Exhaustion** Children can show signs of heat exhaustion before heat stroke, such as heat cramps. Have children take water breaks and wear lightweight clothing when playing outside.
- **Cars** Never leave children alone in a parked car, even for a short time, as the temperature can quickly rise to dangerous levels.

 Always double-check the backseat before locking the car.
- **Cooking** When cooking outside, keep children at least 3 feet away from the grill.
- Fireworks Always supervise children closely around fireworks.
